Employment

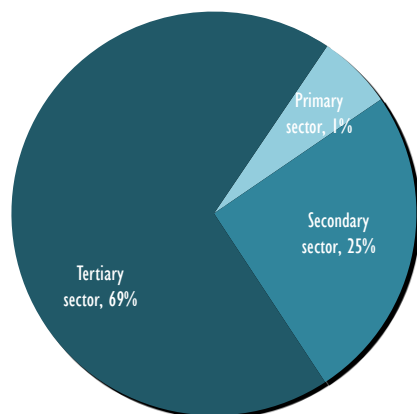
Colima recorded almost 288 thousand workers during 2010, mainly in the commercial and in the agricultural sector. This represents 0.7% for both sectors in relation to personnel in these sectors on a national level.

Economy

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of Colima exceeded 69 billion pesos in 2010, contributing with 0.6% of national GDP.

Tertiary sector, which includes trade and transport, storage and communication, contributed with 69% of the state's GDP in 2010.

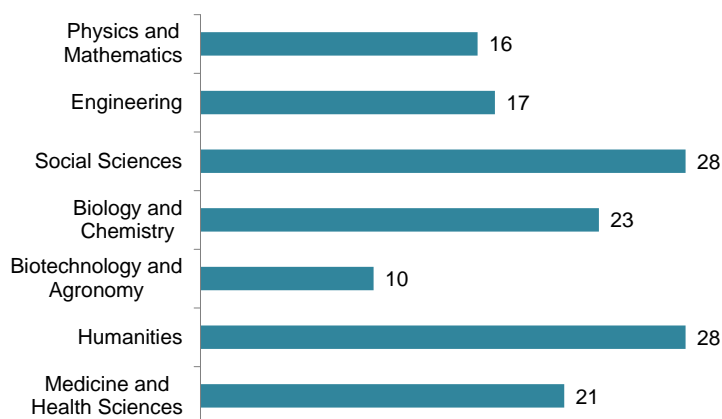
