Employment

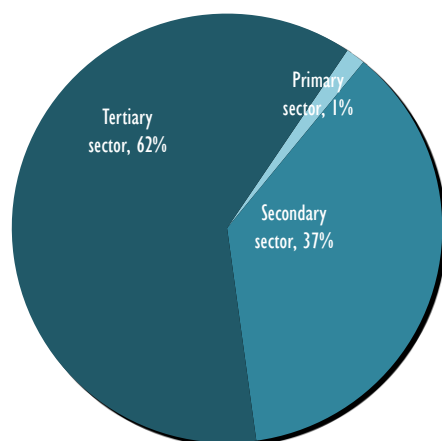
The State of Mexico recorded almost 6 million workers during 2010, mainly in the commercial and in the manufacturing industries. In respect to the national level, the state represented 16.0% of the workers in the commercial industry and 14.9% in the manufacturing industry.

Economy

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of the State of Mexico exceeded 1 trillion pesos in 2010, contributing with 9.4% of national GDP.

Tertiary sector, which includes trade and real estate services, contributed with 62% of the state's GDP in 2010.

Foreign Direct Investment

- The State of Mexico received 917 million dollars in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in 2010, which represented 5.2% of FDI received in Mexico.
- Of all the FDI received by the state, almost all was directed toward the manufacturing industry, followed by retail trade sector, among others.

Salaries

The State of Mexico recorded an average salary for IMSS contribution of \$237.7 in 2010, which was above the country's average of \$236.6.

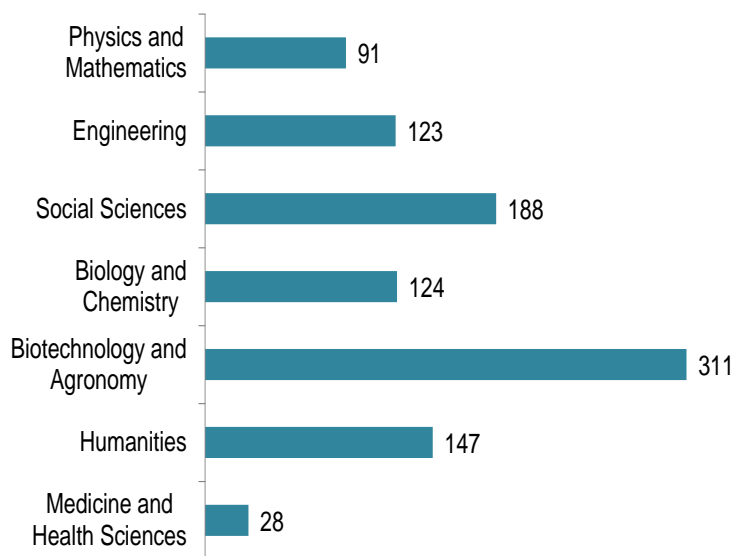
