Employment

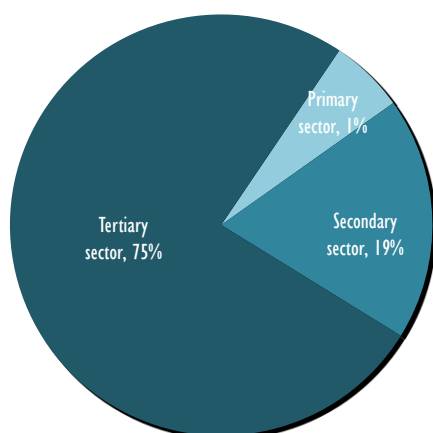
Guerrero recorded 1.1 million workers during 2010, mainly in the agricultural and in the commercial sectors. In respect to the national level, the state represented 5.1% of the workers in the agricultural sector and 2.3% in the commercial sector.

Economy

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of Guerrero exceeded 186 billion pesos in 2010, and contributed 1.5% of Mexico's national GDP.

Tertiary sector, which includes trade and real estate services, contributed with 75% of the state's GDP in 2010.

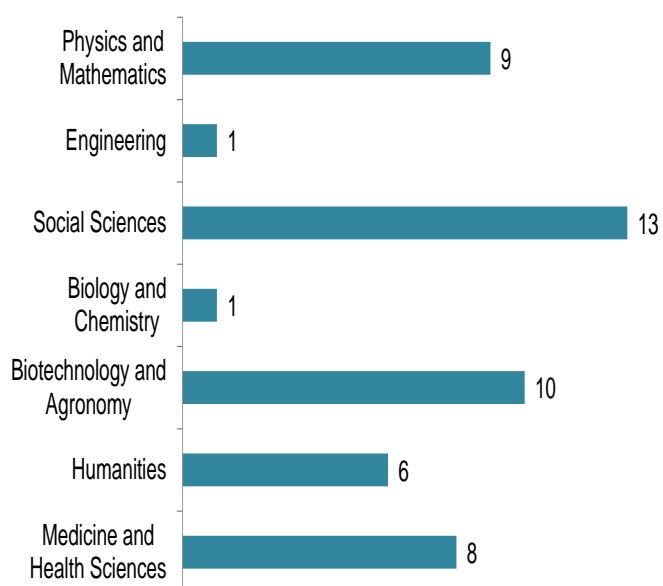
Out of 89,298 students who graduated from engineering and technology in Mexico, 1,157 graduated in the state of Guerrero during the 2008-2009 cycle.

Mexico recorded more than 16,000 researchers at January 2011; 0.3% of them were in Guerrero.

Most of the researchers in the state focused on the areas of social sciences, biotechnology, and agronomy.
